
Practice your interview skills with a virtual interviewer!

Prepare your resume then prepare, practice and evaluate your communication skills before you interview! Sign up on-line with Career Services www.winona.edu/career for an InterviewStream practice interview session and you'll learn to present yourself more effectively during a job interview. Impress your potential employer by practicing answers to commonly asked questions to gain confidence.

- A Web based calendar is available on the Career Services website so you can sign up for an appointment when it's convenient for you.
- Prepare for on or off-campus interviews by practicing the answers to self selected and random interview questions without feeling embarrassed if you don't answer correctly.
- Understand what to expect during the interview process.
- Conducted in the privacy of a closed office. The interface is as though you are interacting with a real person.
- Catch any flaws by seeing and hearing yourself after your interview, redo a question that you don't think you answered well.
- Practice looking into the eyes of the employer.
- Learn what most employers are looking for in responses.
- Improve and assess your own performance.
- Improve on your non-verbal interview skills by overcoming distracting habits or mannerisms that you didn't know you had. Do you fidget, touch your hair a lot, repeat yourself, make odd facial gestures, use your hands too much, or say uhmmm or ahhh when uncertain how to answer the question?
- You will realize what it takes to prepare for a real interview, develop your confidence by practicing again and again to get over the fear.
- Email your practice interview to family, friends, or professors for feedback.
- Set up an appointment with a Career Advisor to give you ideas for improvement.
- Try again, until you are satisfied with the results and comfortable enough to go to that interview that may lead to a rewarding career!
- Add a direct link to your interview from an email or your electronic resume.
