Background Information: We previously listed all RTTR internships under RTTR 399. Some time ago we sent through a notification that we were going to begin listing the *Recreation and Tourism* internships under 397 and the *Therapeutic Recreation Internships* under 399. At that time we neglected to submit the revised description for RTTR 399. We have now included this information along with an updated description of the 397 course as well.

<p><u>Internship in Recreation and Tourism or Therapeutic Recreation (1-12 SH)</u> The application of skill, knowledge and concepts necessary for planning, organizing and conducting recreation and leisure services. Permission and 2.50 GPA overall as it appears on the DARS (Degree Audit Reporting System) at the end of the semester preceding the internship experience. Therapeutic Recreation interns also must obtain a copy of their intern supervisor's current NCTRC certification certificate. Interns must complete a 12 (or more) consecutive week, 480-hour placement under the supervision of a qualified recreation specialist. Prerequisite: Senior standing in the RTTR major and completion of recreation core courses or instructor's permission. P/NC only.</p>	<p><u>Revised Description for RTTR 399 - Internship in Therapeutic Recreation (1-12 SH)</u> The application of skill, knowledge and concepts necessary for assessing, planning, conducting and evaluating individualized and group Therapeutic Recreation programs. Permission and 2.50 GPA overall as it appears on the DARS (Degree Audit Reporting System) report at the end of the semester preceding the internship experience. Therapeutic Recreation interns must complete 15 (or more) consecutive week, 600 hour placements under the supervision of a qualified, Certified Therapeutic Recreation Specialist. Pre-requisite: Senior standing in the TR major and completion of recreation and therapeutic recreation core courses or instructors permission. P/NC only.</p>
<p><i>[Faint, illegible text from the old description]</i></p>	<p><u>Revised Description for RTTR 397 - Internship in Recreation and Tourism (1-12 SH)</u> The application of skill, knowledge and concepts necessary for assessing, planning, conducting and evaluating Recreation and Tourism programs. Permission and 2.50 GPA overall as it appears on the DARS (Degree Audit Reporting System) report at the end of the semester preceding the internship experience. Interns must complete a 12 or 15 consecutive week, 480 or 600 hour placement under the supervision of a qualified Recreation or Tourism specialist. Pre-requisite: Senior standing in the RT major and completion of Recreation core courses or instructors permission. P/NC only.</p>
