I have a plan for courses I need to take to finish my major and minors, but few of these courses are offered this summer. Alternatively, offering some of the courses required to progress in a major/minor during the summer may be a good idea. For example, I was considering switching my minor to biology, but the majority of biology classes need the same prerequisites (such as Basics of Life or Genetics). However, Basics of Life was not offered during the summer, and Genetics is only offered in Summer Session 1 when I am already taking a lab course that I anticipate will take much of my time and effort. As a consequence of this, I dismissed my plan to switch to a biology minor in order to finish on time.


I really like the completely online classes for the summer because I can't commute down to Winona over the summers

statistics majors don't have options to take high-level major courses during the summer so we can't catch up or get ahead.






UGLevelDescription
