<u>Ted Foss Scholarship</u>	The Ted Foss Scholarship is created for students who have declared a major in WSU's Criminal Justice/Law Enforcement program. Each recipient must sign a waiver allowing the Criminal Justice Department to conduct a criminal history records check on them.	Each recipient must sign a waiver allowing the Criminal Justice Department to conduct a criminal history records check on them. Selection Process: 1) The annual scholarship shall be given to a recipient who meets the qualifications. 2) Final selection of the awardee shall be made by a faculty committee within the Criminal Justice Department or through the Scholarship Committee of the WSU Foundation. 3) The scholarship is renewable if the recipient continues to meet the original qualifications and remains in good standing at WSU. However, the student must reapply. 4) The criteria used in selecting a scholarship award recipient will be, in order of importance, the student's: a) academic record (3.5 GPA minimum) b) volunteer service record c) financial need 5) The award is to be made only if there is a qualified candidate.
<u>Friends of Ted Foss Memorial Scholarship</u>	The Friends of Ted Foss Memorial Scholarship is created for students majoring in WSU's Criminal Justice Department. Each recipient must sign a waiver allowing the Criminal Justice Department to conduct a criminal history records check on them. Selection Process: 1) The annual scholarship shall be given to a recipient who meets the qualifications. 2) Final selection of awardee shall be made by a faculty committee within the Criminal Justice Department or through the Scholarship Committee of the WSU Foundation. 3) The scholarship is renewable if the recipient continues to meet the original qualifications and remains in good standing at WSU. However, the student must reapply. 4) The criteria used in selecting a scholarship award recipient will be, in order of importance, the student's: a) academic record (3.5 GPA minimum) b) volunteer service record c) financial need 5) The award is to be made only if there is a qualified candidate.
<u>James W. &amp; Mildred K. McCabe Scholarship</u>	The James W. & Mildred K. McCabe Scholarship is created to encourage and support students in the Department of Criminal Justice at WSU.	Selection Process: Final selection of the awardee will be made by a faculty committee within the Criminal Justice Department. The scholarship shall be given to recipients who meet the qualifications. Preference should be given to a student who has demonstrated community service in law enforcement (i.e., police reserves or Big Brothers and Big Sisters Programs). Preference should be given to a student who plans to become a police officer in Minnesota. Preference should be given to a student who demonstrates financial need through WSU Financial Aid Office. Preference should be given to a student graduating from a Winona County High School or a Buffalo County, Wisconsin High School. Each recipient must sign a waiver allowing the Criminal Justice Department to conduct a criminal history records check on them. The criteria used in selecting a scholarship award recipient will be, in order of importance, the student's 1) volunteer service record, 2) academic record (3.0 GPA minimum in major); and 3) financial need. The recipient may reapply for the scholarship if he/she continues to meet the original qualifications and remains in good standing at WSU. The award is to be made only if there is a qualified candidate.

<p><u>Jennifer Nesler/ACJA Scholarship</u></p>	<p>The Jennifer Nesler/ACJA Scholarship is created for students who have declared a major in WSU's Criminal Justice program.</p>	<p>If two \$200 awards are given, one recipient shall have selected the law enforcement track and the second recipient shall have selected the corrections track. Selection Process: 1) The annual scholarship award shall be given to a recipient who meets the qualifications. The award will be renewable for a second year if a minimum GPA of 2.5 is maintained. The recipient must send a copy of his/her transcript to the Chairman of the Department of Sociology at the end of the first-year award for consideration of a second-year award. 2) Final selection of the awardee shall be made by two faculty members involved in the Criminal Justice committee and one non-applying student representative of the Criminal Justice Association, with final approval by the Dean of Liberal Arts; or through the Scholarship Committee of the WSU Foundation. 3) The criteria used in selecting a scholarship award recipient will be, in order of importance, the student's 1) academic record (2.5 GPA minimum); 2) financial need and 3) ability and promise in the field of law enforcement. 4) All monies will be permanently retained by the WSU Foundation.</p>
<p><u>James &amp; Celine Norman Memorial Scholarship</u></p>	<p>The James &amp; Celine Norman Memorial Scholarship is created for students majoring in the Criminal Justice program.</p>	<p>Selection Process: 1) The annual scholarship award shall be given to a recipient who meets the qualifications. 2) The award will be renewable for a second year if a minimum GPA of 3.0 in Criminal Justice course work and a minimum cumulative GPA of 2.5 is maintained. The recipient must send a copy of his/her transcript to the Criminal Justice Program Coordinator and complete an interview with the Sociology/Criminal Justice Scholarship Committee at the end of the first-year award in order to be considered for a second-year award. 3) Final selection of the awardee shall be made by the Sociology/Criminal Justice Scholarship Committee. 4) The criteria used in selecting a scholarship award recipient will include, in order of importance, the student's: a) academic record (minimum GPA of 3.0 in Criminal Justice course work and a cumulative GPA of 2.5); b) financial need; c) ability and promise in the field of Criminal Justice.</p>
<p>Anna &amp; John Bowers Scholarship</p>	<p>The Anna &amp; John Bowers Memorial Scholarship is for a non-traditional single female student with dependent children, enrolled full-time with a GPA of 2.5 or greater. The female student must be classified as a sophomore, junior, or senior.</p>	<p>Selection Process: 1) The annual scholarship shall be given to a recipient who meets the qualifications. 2) This scholarship is renewable for up to two consecutive years if the recipient continues to meet the original qualifications. 3) Final selection of the awardee shall be made by a faculty committee within the Sociology/Criminal Justice Department. 4) The criteria used in selecting a scholarship award recipient will be, in order of importance, the student's: a) financial need b) ability and promise in the field of corrections 5) The award is to be made only if there is a qualified candidate.</p>

Ervin G. Bublitz Scholarship	The Ervin G. Bublitz Scholarship is for an undergraduate full-time junior or senior student who has declared a major in Winona State University's Sociology/Criminal Justice Program. This scholarship is to be applied exclusively toward payment of tuition and fees.	This scholarship is to be applied exclusively toward payment of tuition and fees. If the recipient is graduating fall semester of their senior year, he/she shall receive the full scholarship amount in the fall semester. Selection Process: 1) The annual scholarship award shall be given to a recipient who meets the qualifications. The award will be renewable for a second year if a minimum GPA of 2.5 is maintained. The recipient must send a copy of his/her transcript to the Chairman of the Department of Sociology at the end of this first-year award for consideration of a second-year award. 2) If monies in the fund permit a second scholarship award, it must be given to a declared Sociology major. If more than two scholarships are given, the awards will be given to declared majors in Sociology: Criminal Justice and B.A. Sociology in proportion to the numbers of graduating majors. 3) Final selection of the awardee shall be made by the faculty of the Sociology Department with approval by the Dean of Liberal Arts or through the Scholarship Committee of the WSU Foundation. 4) The criteria used in selecting a scholarship award recipient will be, in order of importance, the student's: 1) academic record (2.5 GPA minimum); 2) financial need, and; 3) ability and promise in the field of Sociology and/or Criminal Justice.
<u>John D. Bublitz Scholarship</u>	The John D. Bublitz Scholarship is for full-time undergraduate junior or senior students who have declared a major in Winona State University's Criminal Justice/Law Enforcement program.	If the recipient is graduating fall semester of their senior year, he/she shall receive the full scholarship amount in the fall semester. Selection Process: 1) The annual scholarship award shall be given to a recipient who meets the qualifications. The award will be renewable for a second year if a minimum GPA of 2.5 is maintained. The recipient must send a copy of his/her transcript to the Chairman of the Department of Sociology at the end of the first-year award for consideration of a second-year award. 2) If monies in the fund permit a second scholarship award, it must be given to a declared major in Criminal Justice/Law Enforcement. 3) The faculty of the Sociology Department shall make the final selection of the awardees with approval by the Dean of Liberal Arts or through the Scholarship Committee of the WSU Foundation. 4) The criteria used in selecting a scholarship award recipient will be, in order of importance, the student's: 1) academic record (2.5 GPA minimum); 2) financial need, and; 3) ability and promise in the field of law enforcement.
<u>Bublitz Sociology &amp; Criminal Justice Department Scholarship</u>	The Bublitz Scholarship for the Department of Sociology & Criminal Justice is for a full-time junior or senior undergraduate students who have a declared major and accepted within each program in Winona State University's Sociology or Criminal Justice.	Selection Process: 1) The annual scholarships shall be given to recipients who meet the qualifications. 2) The award may be renewable for a second year. However, the recipients must reapply with all application requirements. 3) The awards will be given to declared majors in Sociology or Criminal Justice in proportion to the number of declared majors within each program. For 2015-2016: 2 awards to Sociology and 4 award to Criminal Justice. 4) Final selection of the awardee shall be made by the faculty of the Sociology Department with approval by the Dean of Liberal Arts. 5) The criteria used in selecting a scholarship recipient will be, in order of importance, the student's: a) academic record (2.5 GPA minimum) b) ability and promise in the field of Sociology or Criminal Justice and may include related work and volunteer experience. c) financial need. 6) Applicants may apply during their sophomore or junior year. 7) The award is to be made only if there is a qualified candidate.

<p><u>James &amp; Nancy Reynolds Scholarship</u></p>	<p>The James &amp; Nancy Reynolds Scholarship is created to support students at WSU. Recipients must be a declared major in B.A. Sociology (first preference) or B.S. Sociology: Criminal Justice (second preference).</p>	<p>Recipients must be a declared major in B.A. Sociology (first preference) or B.S. Sociology: Criminal Justice (second preference). Selection Process: The selection of the awardee shall be made by the Sociology Faculty Scholarship Committee, with the approval of the Dean of the College of Liberal Arts and Scholarship Committee of the WSU Foundation. The selection process shall include the following steps: a) the applicant completes the scholarship application, and submits all requested support materials; b) faculty shall review all applications and give first preference to eligible students majoring in B.A. Sociology and second preference to eligible students majoring in B.S. Sociology: Criminal Justice, based on the scholarship criteria listed below. The scholarship award criteria to be used by the Sociology Faculty Scholarship Committee shall include: a) verification that the scholarship application and all supporting materials have been submitted for review; b) verification that the student is a declared and admitted student majoring in the B.A. Sociology (first preference) or B.S. Sociology: Criminal Justice (second preference) program; c) academic record (minimum of 3.0 GPA in the major and 2.5 overall); d) ability and promise in the field, based on a short, written essay of past and present accomplishments and personal and career goals; and e) demonstrated financial need, based on a written statement about how the student is financing their education. This scholarship will be renewable for a second year if the minimum GPA within the major and overall are maintained and satisfactory progress is shown toward completing the degree. The recipient must submit a copy of their transcript to the Sociology Faculty Scholarship Committee through the chairperson of the Department of Sociology/Social Work in order for consideration of an award for a second year</p>
