Costs for Summer, Semester and Year-Long Programs

WSU students will pay study away tuition and program fees for the term that they will be gone. The program fee is determined in the following way.

- 1. The Study Abroad office receives the program cost from the various program providers. Program providers charge a fee that includes the cost of your WSU credits.
- 2. This fee generally includes a program's on-site tuition, international emergency insurance, and some excursions. Room and board is typically billed directly to the student. Because programs differ widely, it is essential to confer with the Study Abroad Office to determine exactly what is covered in each case. Program fees will vary greatly from student to student, depending on where you go and for how long. Some program fees, such as exchanges, may be less than WSU tuition, room and board, while others could be more than \$25,000 for a semester.
- 3. Program fees *do not* usually include airfare or other non-covered personal expenses. Depending on the program, these personal expenses may include food or housing as well as travel and visa costs, immunizations, souvenirs, etc.

Generally, all WSU financial aid applies to approved semester and year-long programs with the exception of student work-study and certain scholarships that require on-campus participation. Additional aid in the form of loan funding may be available. Tuition waivers may NOT be used for semester or summer non-faculty-led programs. Please contact the Financial Aid Office for more information.

WSU study abroad students will receive a *Cost Estimate for Study Abroad* which will provide them with an ESTIMATE for their tuition, program fee, airfare and personal spending money for their term abroad. Financial aid awards are not factored into this worksheet.

A non-refundable \$65 WSU application fee is due at the time of application. A non-refundable *program commitment deposit* of \$500 will also be required to confirm a student's spot in a program. This deposit is applied to the program costs.

Both a student's tuition amount and the program fee (as determined above) will be listed on the student's regular WSU bill. WSU bills will be sent by Winona State and are due to Winona State at the regular payment deadlines. Note that for some programs (IFSA is one example), WSU must bill the student and pay the program provider before all final bills are in or known. We may need to bill a student for a certain type of housing before it is known what kind of housing they will receive. These situations require a *supplemental housing bill or other supplemental bills* which will be sent direct to the student and must be paid by the student direct to the program provider.
