<u>Europe</u>

United Kingdom

Aberdeen - University of Aberdeen (Direct Enroll)

With over 70 undergraduate majors offered at the University, you will find a great choice of classes to take at Aberdeen and will be able to tailor your selection to suit your individual requirements. Take Film courses like Film and Politics: German and Austrian Filmmakers Facing the World, African Cinema, and Documentary Theory and Practice.

London – UW-Platteville Education Abroad at St Mary's University Twickenham, London

UW-Platteville Education Abroad has been helping students from the United States study at St Mary's University Twickenham, London since 1998. St Mary's provides students with a values-based education that is open to all, and where all students and staff are respected and valued. Film classes include Screen Theory and Criticism, The Paradox of Horror, and North American Cinema.

FACULTY-LED PROGRAMS

Asia

Japan - Old Meets New: Timeless Japan

3 credits: GS 320. GS 320 counts toward **Goal Area 5**. Takes place during Summer (13 days in May). Students will experience the modern way of life in Japan. They will analyze Japanese pop culture, its origins, and how it evolved since WWII.

<u>Europe</u>

Czech Republic and Hungary - Cities of Fairytales: Prague and Budapest

6 credits: ART 313 (3 credits) and ART 398 (3 credits). ART 313 counts toward **Goal Areas 6B and 8.** Takes place during Summer (18-22 days in May/June). Students complete intensive reading, lecture, studio art practice (design, photography, drawing and painting), group discussions, field trips, and art and design projects to learn and understand contemporary European society.

Italy - Taste of Italy

6 credits: ART 313 (3 credits) and ART 398/ART 299. ART 313 counts towards **Goal Areas 6B and 8**. Takes place during Summer (15-18 days in May). Students will learn about and focus on art, design, visual culture, and lifestyle in contemporary Italy against the backdrop of its rich ancient history.
