# Global

## Multiple Locations - Semester at Sea

Semester at Sea is a multiple country study abroad program open to students of all majors emphasizing comparative academic examination, hands-on field experiences, and meaningful engagement in the global community. A wide variety of coursework from 20-25 disciplines is integrated with field studies in up to a dozen countries, allowing for a study abroad experience that is truly global.

# **Africa**

# Senegal

#### Dakar - University of Minnesota: MSID Senegal

Spend seven weeks engaged in coursework, followed by six weeks working as an intern or conducting a research project with a local grassroots organization. All classes are taught in French by local faculty. Students will choose a theme for their studies and their internship or research project. The themes are entrepreneurship, health, human rights, and sustainability.

# China

# Shanghai - <u>CIEE Open Campus Block Program in Shanghai</u>

Students can study in vibrant and modern Shanghai, China through CIEE's open campus program. Students build their own block schedules and can take blocks that range from six to twelve weeks long in one or two locations. Shanghai is the country's biggest city and a global financial hub. Eat traditional food and learn from the locals.

#### Japan

#### Akita - Akita International University - Exchange

English is the main language of instruction at Akita International University, and certain features of an American-style university curriculum are followed with the goal of meeting the highest internationally recognized educational standards. Exchange students pay WSU tuition, making this an affordable option. A variety of coursework in English is offered, like International Relations, Comparative Politics, and Forced Migration. Japanese language classes are also offered and highly encouraged.

# Osaka – <u>Kansai Gaidai – Exchange</u>

Kansai Gaidai is located outside Osaka, Japan. The campus hosts approximately 13,000 students, including 700 international students. Kansai Gaidai is an exchange partner, which means students pay Winona State tuition and the host university's room and board. Take Global Studies classes like Culture, Power, and Belonging in Japan: Anthropological Perspectives on the Making of Minorities and Majorities; International Business Law, and Japan and Globalization: A Cultural Approach.

#### **South Korea**

#### Seoul - Chung-Ang University - Exchange

Established in 1918, CAU has taken a leading role in nurturing intellectuals of the nation. Chung-Ang is fully committed to helping Korean and international students realize their life goals and achieve their greatest potential. Take Global Studies classes like International Finance, International Political Economy, and Korean and Global Politics.

# Chiang Mai – <u>USAC Thailand: Chiang Mai – Southeast Asia Culture, Politics, and Business</u>

The Chiang Mai program is ideal for students who are interested in the economics, philosophy, politics, religions, culture, and language of Thailand and other Southeast Asian countries, in a city that is manageable, walkable, exotic, and unforgettable. Take Global Studies classes like World Economic Issues, Thai Society and Culture, and Peace and Conflict Studies.

#### **Costa Rica**

## San Jose – <u>CIS Abroad Semester or Summer in Costa Rica – Universidad Veritas</u>

Located in the heart of San Jose, students can take courses in English, Spanish or both. On-campus activities include dance classes, cooking classes, and intramural sports. With 1,500 Costa Rican students and over 500 international students, you'll benefit from a close-knit but cosmopolitan campus. Global Studies students can choose from courses like Human Rights in Latin America, Costa Rican Tradition: Peace and Democracy, and Introduction to International Economics in Latin America.

## **Czech Republic**

# Prague - AIFS Abroad in Prague, Charles University: Semester or Academic Year

Live in a student residence hall in Prague and enjoy cultural activities such as guided city walks, visits to museums, cultural sites, opera, theater and ballet, sporting events and language events to practice the language. Take Global Studies classes like Czech Cultural Studies: Official and Unofficial Cultures in the Communist Czechoslovakia 1948-1989, Economic Decline of European Empires, and Central Europe in the Context of European Integration.

# **France**

## Paris - CIEE Open Campus Block Program in Paris

Study in Paris, France, the gorgeous "City of Lights," that is one of the biggest fashion capitals of the world and is rich with history through CIEE's open campus program. Students build their own block schedules and can take blocks that range from six to twelve weeks long in one or two locations. Global Studies classes include Intercultural Communication and Leadership, Contemporary Challenges in Global Health, and Migration and Mobility in a Global World.

#### Barcelona - Barcelona SAE: International Business of Humanities Semester Program

The International Business and Humanities Program based at the Universidad Autónoma de Barcelona (UAB) is perfect for those looking to get their feet wet on a global scale. You will take courses in English or Spanish for your major, minor, or general education requirements, all while absorbing Spanish at an astonishing rate thanks to your intensive language course. Global Studies courses include Inequality, Poverty, and Globalization; International Marketing Strategies, and Mediterranean Politics.

# Kristianstad - Kristianstad University - Exchange

Kristianstad University, in southern Sweden, was founded in 1977, but can trace its roots way back for teacher's training (1835), nurses (1893), and engineers (1912). Kristianstad is a beautiful city with easy access to larger cities and mainland Europe. Take Global Studies courses like Intercultural Communication, International Rhetoric, and Sweden: Culture and Society.

# **FACULTY-LED PROGRAMS**

Faculty-led programs are short-term study abroad programs led by WSU faculty. These programs take place over breaks (winter, spring, or summer) and students earn 3-6 WSU credits. The following faculty-led programs are recommended for students in this major.

# <u>Asia</u>

#### Japan - Old Meets New: Timeless Japan

3 credits: GS 320 counts toward **Goal Area 5**. Takes place during Summer (13 days in May). Students will experience the modern way of life in Japan. They will analyze Japanese pop culture, its origins, and how it evolved since WWII.

## **Nepal - People and Culture of Nepal**

3 credits for SOC 294. Takes place during Summer (15-19 days in May/June). Students will learn about the people living in the shadows of Himalayas and experience Nepali culture by directly interacting with local people and communities.

# Europe

#### **Spain - Unity in Diversity**

6 credits in GS 350. Takes place during Summer (21-25 days in May/June). Students will study different aspects of the culture of Spain today, with a special focus on its cultural and linguistic diversity.

#### South America

#### Ecuador - Civic Engagement and the Environment in Ecuador - Summer

6 credits in GS 375 counts toward **Goal Areas 9 and 10** Takes place during Summer (17-20 days in May/June). Students explore ways local events are linked to global processes and ways Natives are implementing "development with identity" on their own terms by using intercultural strategies, local and hybrid knowledge sets, and local governance.

#### Civic Engagement and the Environment in Ecuador – Winter Break

3 credits for GS 375 counts toward **Goal Areas 9 and 10** Takes place during Winter Break (12-14 days in December/January). Students explore ways local events are linked to global processes and ways Natives are implementing "development with identity" on their own terms by using intercultural strategies, local and hybrid knowledge sets, and local governance.

# Puerto Rico - <u>Understandings of Puerto Rican Identity</u>

4 credits for GS 350. Takes place during Summer (13-16 days in June/July). Students will examine and study the complex culture and diversity on the Puerto Rican Island.
