This degree program prepares the student for a Minnesota K-12 Teaching License in Music with an Instrumental Emphasis. This licensure allows graduates of the program to obtain a teaching position in band, orchestra, or classroom music at all levels, kindergarten through high school. Course requirements, along with core music classes, include music teaching methods, and a series of courses offered by the education department, including student teaching at both elementary and secondary levels. Due to the stringent requirements of the state's licensure program and the need for developing skills and knowledge in both music and education, the credit requirements for this degree are higher than other programs and students usually student teach in their 5th year of study.
