

## Program Assessment: Goals and Outcomes

### Master of Science in Athletic Training: Program Goals and Outcomes

1. Academic and Program Success – WSU MSAT students will be prepared academically, clinically and professionally to successfully sit for the Board of Certification (BOC) exam.
  - a. All students will maintain a 3.0 overall GPA or above throughout the MSAT program.
  - b. Each MSAT cohort will achieve a 90% retention and graduation rate.
  - c. Each MSAT cohort will achieve a 90% first time pass rate on the BOC Exam.
  - d. Each MSAT cohort will achieve a 100% overall pass rate on the BOC Exam.
  - e. Each MSAT cohort will achieve a 100% placement rate within six months post-graduation.
  - f. Overall scores on Alumni surveys will show a rating of “competent” (3.0) regarding program effectiveness and success following graduation.
  - g. Employer surveys will indicate MSAT graduates are in the top 50% as compared to other entry level professionals in athletic training when assessing academic and clinical preparation of the MSAT graduate.

2. Clinical Success – WSU MSAT students will be prepared in a variety of clinical settings, including traditional and emerging areas of practice, that allow them to function as quality healthcare providers upon graduation.
  - a. All students will achieve a grade of “B” or better in all Athletic Training Clinical Experience (I-V) courses.
  - b. All students will achieve an overall rating of “advanced beginner” (2.0) on all Clinical Evaluation forms from assigned preceptors during their first year in the MSAT program.
  - c. All students will achieve an overall rating of “competent” (3.0) on all Clinical Evaluation forms from assigned preceptors during their immersion experiences (HERS 691 and 692) during their second year in the MSAT program.
  - d. All students will achieve an overall rating of “competent” (3.0) on assessment of CAATE content standards via preceptor evaluation or clinical assessment exam(s) (simulation, standardized patient scenarios or OSCE) by the end of the program.
  - e. Graduates will self-report an overall rating of “competent” (3.0) on the Alumni Survey when assessing their ability to clinically practice as a certified athletic trainer.

  - b. All students will achieve a rating of “competent” (3.0) on all Clinical Evaluation forms relating to interprofessional care during their immersion experiences (HERS 691 and 692). (Question #12)
  - c. All students will achieve a grade of 70% or above on an interprofessional collaborative practice quality improvement project (aspiration goal = 80%).
  - d. Graduates will self-report an overall rating of “competent” (3.0) on the Alumni Survey when assessing their ability to appropriately utilize an interprofessional team approach to healthcare.

  - c. Graduates will self-report an overall rating of “competent” (3.0) on the Alumni Survey when assessing their ability to appropriately utilize evidence in the care of a patient population.

  - b. All students will achieve a rating of “competent” (3.0) on all Clinical Evaluation forms from assigned preceptors regarding ethical decision making during their immersion experiences (HERS 691 and 692). (Question #8 and #9)
  - c. All students will attend a minimum of one professional conference in the field of athletic training prior to graduation.
  - d. Graduates will self-report an overall rating of “competent” (3.0) on the Alumni Survey when assessing their ability to appropriately make ethical/professional decisions.
