6 Is the Individualized Studies Degree Right for You?

The **Individualized Studies program** at Winona State University is ideal for students ready to take charge of their education and design a degree that reflects their unique goals and experiences. This program may be a great fit if you:

- Want to combine multiple disciplines into a cohesive, thematic degree that aligns with your academic and career aspirations.
- Are a working adult seeking to complete a bachelor's degree to advance professionally or achieve personal or vocational milestones.
- Need a custom minor in an area where a traditional minor isn't available.
- **Require flexible course options**—including online, hybrid, and in-person formats— to balance school with work, family, or other life commitments.

When It Might Not Be the Best Fit

While the program offers exceptional flexibility and personalization, it may not be suitable for everyone. You might want to consider other options if:

- You're still undecided about your major or career path. A clear vision is essential for designing a meaningful and goal-oriented degree.
- You prefer structured guidance over self-directed learning. This program requires initiative, independence, and strong organizational skills.
- Your career requires a specific degree or licensure. For example, if you plan to become a licensed teacher, this program does not meet the requirements for teacher certification.

Program Requirements

The **Individualized Studies program** at WSU is an excellent option for motivated, self-directed students—especially adult learners—who want to design a degree tailored to their unique goals. The program is available as a **major or minor** and can lead to a **Bachelor of Arts (BA)** or **Bachelor of Applied Science (BAS)** degree.

Bachelor of Arts (BA) - No Minor Required (INDS)

Total Major Credits: 49

- INDS 300: Academic Planning & Career Foundations (3 credits)
 - Grade of C or better required
- INDS 495: Capstone Experience (3 credits)
 - Grade of C or better required
- 34 upper-division elective credits (300–400 level, excluding INDS 300 & 495)
- 9 elective credits from any level (100–400)
- Up to 9 credits may be taken Pass/No Credit (P/NC)
- 40 credits must be unique to the major
- Completion of WSU General Education & Intensive Requirements
- Minimum GPA: 2.0 and 120 total credits
- 30 credits must be completed at WSU during junior/senior years
- Must be enrolled in at least 1 WSU credit during the graduation semester

Bachelor of Arts (BA) – With Required Minor (INDM)

Total Major Credits: 36

- Same core requirements as above:
 - INDS 300 (3 credits)
 - INDS 495 (3 credits)
- 24 upper-division elective credits (300-400 level)
- 6 elective credits from any level (100–400)
- Up to 9 credits may be taken P/NC
- 27 credits must be unique to the major
- Completion of WSU General Education & Intensive Requirements
- Completion of a minor is required
- Minimum GPA: 2.0 and 120 total credits
- 30 credits must be completed at WSU during junior/senior years
- Must be enrolled in at least 1 WSU credit during the graduation semester

Bachelor of Applied Science (BAS) – No Minor Required (INDP) Total Major Credits: 49

- Same core requirements as BA (INDS):
 - INDS 300 (3 credits)
 - INDS 495 (3 credits)
- 34 upper-division elective credits (300-400 level)
- 9 elective credits from any level (100–400)
- Up to 9 credits may be taken P/NC
- 40 credits must be unique to the major
- Completion of WSU General Education & Intensive Requirements
- Minimum GPA: 2.0 and 120 total credits
- 30 credits must be completed at WSU during junior/senior years
- Must be enrolled in at least 1 WSU credit during the graduation semester

Minor in Individualized Studies (INDS)

Total Credits: 21

- INDS 300: Academic Planning & Career Foundations (3 credits)

 Grade of C or better required
- 12 upper-division elective credits (300–400 level)
- 6 elective credits from any level (100–400)
- **Up to 9 credits** may overlap with your major or General Education Program (GEP)

Your **DARS** (**Degree Audit Reporting System**) is your most accurate and up-to-date resource for tracking degree progress. Be sure to work closely with your **academic advisor** to ensure all program and university requirements are met.

Individualized Studies Program: Step-by-Step Guide

Step 1: Explore Your Options

Considering a major or minor in Individualized Studies? Start by meeting with one of our academic advisors. They'll help you explore how the program aligns with your interests and career goals, and answer any questions you may have.

This handbook provides detailed information about the program, but if anything is unclear, don't hesitate to **reach out**.

- New to WSU? We invite you to apply and begin your academic journey with us!

Step 2: Declare Your Major or Minor

There is no formal application process for the Individualized Studies major or minor. If you're a current student, simply complete the **Declaration of Major or Minor** form to update your academic records.

Step 3: Develop Your Student Program Plan

All Individualized Studies students must create a **Student Program Plan**, which is a personalized academic roadmap tailored to their career and educational goals.

- This plan is developed as part of INDS 300: Academic Planning and Career Foundations.
- We recommend enrolling in INDS 300 as soon as possible after declaring your major or minor.
- If you can't take INDS 300 right away, you may begin drafting your plan in consultation with your advisor.

Your <u>Student Program Plan</u> must be approved and on file. It includes:

- Basic Student Information
- Rationale
- Curriculum Design
- Course List
- Learning Outcomes
- Occupational Outlook

Step 4: Complete Your Courses

Follow your approved Student Program Plan to complete your coursework. If you need to make changes, update your plan before graduation.

- Meet with your advisor each semester before registering.
- Consider internship opportunities to enhance your experience.
- Refer to the course information section for more details.

Step 5: Apply for Graduation

Once you've registered for your final term, submit your **online graduation application**.

- All graduation requirements must be completed or in progress at the time of application.
- Use your DARS report to verify your progress.
- If anything is missing, schedule a meeting with your advisor.
- If you plan to register later (e.g., for an internship or practicum), note this in the comments section of the application.
- You can also list any transfer courses you plan to complete in your final term.



Experiential Learning Opportunities

Internship Courses

Internships are a valuable component of the Individualized Studies program. They offer hands-on experience, skill development, and professional networking opportunities that can significantly enhance your career readiness. We strongly encourage you to include an internship in your academic plan.

Getting Started

Finding the right internship takes time—start your search several months in advance. If you're unsure where to begin, reach out to your Individualized Studies advisor for guidance.

Credit Options

Course Code	Title	Credits	Grading
INDS 398	Internship	1-3 SH	Letter Grade
INDS 399	Internship	1-9 SH	Pass/No Credit

Note: INDS 398 and INDS 399 may be combined for a maximum of 12 credits (majors) or 6 credits (minors).

Credit Hour Conversion: Approximately 40 hours of internship work = 1 academic credit Eligibility

To enroll in an INDS internship course, you must:

- Be an Individualized Studies major or minor
- Have completed at least 60 total credits, including 21 upper-division credits
- Obtain departmental approval

Additional Options

Some academic departments at WSU allow non-majors to complete internships through their department. Consult with your advisor to explore this possibility.

Independent Study
