**Graduate students:** There are three components to earning BUED (5-12) licensure Business Education coursework: 1) Business Education Content coursework, 2) Business Core coursework, and 3) Professional Education coursework (see list of itemized courses below).

**Undergraduate students:** You will apply to WSU (<https://www.winona.edu/admissions/apply/transfer/>) and select "BEDM" as your major. You will complete the three components listed above PLUS the General Education requirements (not listed). **Note: In order to earn a bachelor's degree, you need to earn a minimum of 120 credits. Mankato undergraduate students would need to complete SEVEN additional credits in addition to the coursework (listed below) in order to meet this minimum criteria [40 credits of general education; 25 credits of business education; 18 credits of business content; and 30 credits of education=113].**
