You must complete 31 of these credits at Winona State University. The remaining 41 credits may come from your previous MS program with approval from your advisor.

Applicants will need to show evidence of PMHNP certification and completion of a master's in nursing. There must also be evidence of the following course content from the master's program. Students must submit syllabi of these courses to PMHNP faculty immediately upon admission for review. Otherwise, these courses will need to be taken:

- STAT 601: Statistical Methods for Health Care Research (3)
- NURS 606: Nursing Information Management & Decision Making (3)
- NURS 608: Organizational & Systems Leadership (3)
