

ATI TEAS Tip Sheet and FAQs

Starting with the Spring 2026 application cycle (to start nursing Fall 2026), all Pre Nursing Holistic Admission (PNHA) candidates must submit a qualifying ATI TEAS score as part of eligibility to apply to program. Students without a qualifying score are not eligible to apply in that semester's application process.

ATI TEAS is a computer based timed test with 170 total questions and 209 total minutes testing time. Topics include Reading, Mathematics, Science, English and Language Usage. Questions include multiple choice, multiple select, fill in the blank, ordered response and hot spots.

Students should create a free account with ATI: <https://www.atitesting.com/>

- WSU allows any of the ATI TEAS testing methods. This includes online, at an institution or a PSI Testing Center. Note: Many institutions test for “their students only”, carefully review options.
- Be sure to select the ATI TEAS for NURSING STUDENTS exam when selecting program type (NOT allied health)
- Qualifying Scores (minimum 58.7) must be received by WSU, from ATI TEAS, by application deadline in the semester you are applying to program.
- ATI has a strict rescheduling policy. Please read their [policy](#) prior to registering and paying for the TEAS exam.
- ATI policy requires at least 14 days between test attempts. WSU Undergraduate Nursing suggests you test at least 3 weeks prior to application deadline to allow for a re-take if needed.
- Be sure to send your ATI TEAS test transcript (score report) to WSU. One transcript is included when you take the ATI TEAS. Additional score reports can be ordered through ATI TEAS for a cost.
- WSU Undergraduate Nursing suggests testing after most of your nursing prerequisite courses are completed. The end of the semester prior to application to program or the break period (winter or summer) prior to the semester of application is suggested. The TEAS includes pre nursing content.

- WSU Krueger Library has 6 ATI TEAS Official Study Guides available for reference use (in library use). ATI TEAS also offers an APP included in the cost of testing as well as additional for-purchase review items.

Testing Sites near WSU

UW- La Crosse is a PSI Testing Site: 308 16th St North, 2106 Centennial Hall, La Crosse, WI

Rochester has a PSI Testing Site: 3155 Superior Drive NW Rochester, MN

Minnesota State College Southeast Winona, 1250 Homer Road, Winona, is an institution with a testing center. Southeast WILL allow WSU students to test at their location.

NOTE: when you sign up on the ATI TEAS site for Minnesota State College Southeast Winona there will be a note that says, “Restricted Access School Applicants only”. For this institution ONLY (Southeast) WSU students CAN test here. You will need to pay an additional \$30 fee directly to Southeast when you report for testing (cash or card).

Testing closer to home (during semester breaks, winter and summer breaks)

There are PSI testing sites in the twin cities (St Paul, Eagan, Woodbury) and other parts of Minnesota (Duluth, Brainerd) and in Wisconsin (Steven’s Point, Madison and Milwaukee.) Use this link for PSI testing site look up:
