Program Total: 40 credits; 1 clinical credit = 60 hours (6 clinical scholarship credits = 360 hours; 4 direct role clinical credits = 240 hours; 4 indirect role clinical credits = 240 hours; 840 total clinical hours)

Graduates of a DNP program are required to complete 72 credits and 1,000 clinical hours. Previous master's-level coursework and clinical experience will be assessed to determine eligibility for meeting these requirements.

Applicants must provide evidence of holding at least a master’s in nursing, along with the following required coursework. Upon admission, students are required to submit the syllabi for each of the courses to the program faculty for review. If this content has not been covered, these courses will need to be taken:

- STAT 601:** Statistical Methods for Health Care Professionals (3)
- NURS 606:** Nursing Information Management & Decision Making (3)
- NURS 608:** Organizational & Systems Leadership (3)
- NURS 612:** Advanced Health Promotion (3)
- NURS 617:** Advanced Clinical Pharmacology (3) (within 3 years of graduation in some states for credentialing)
- NURS 618:** Advanced Pathophysiology (4)
- NURS 619:** Advanced Health Assessment (3) (3 *clinical*)
